A.W Tozer once wrote: "Unsaintly saints are the tragedy of Christianity." Some reading this may exclaim, "Well, I'm no saint! I'm a Christian, but I'm no saint."

While this may sound humble before men, it's really a slap in the face of God because it is saying that God can't make me a saint. But what it really shows is how the word "saint" is misunderstood. Biblically, the word "saint" means anyone who believes that Jesus Christ is Lord (simple definition). This person will seek to follow Christ in obedience to Scripture. Therefore, if you are a follower of Jesus Christ, in accordance with His word, then you are a saint. This does not mean that you will never sin, but it does mean that you will seek to be obedient, set-apart, to God and His will for your life and that you will seek to grow closer in your relationship with Him.

May a seeker of Christ never turn away from Him because of the actions of anyone, myself included, in this church. Lord, please help us to truly be saints that please and honor You.

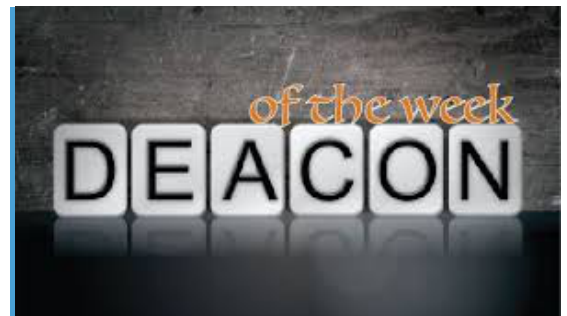
