Think on These Things

"The sorrows which this world inflicts are sorrows which nothing in this world can heal." Dr. J. Sidlow Baxter

I was arrested by this statement when I read it as part of my daily devotional reading. All human beings are subject to sorrows simply because we live in a fallen world. Even those with no apparent struggles, challenges, or hardships will most likely experience sorrow in this life. When one experiences sorrows "...which this world inflicts..." that one often seeks to heal the sorrow by looking for what the world has to offer in order to bring relief. Many times a person may go to friends, family, or counselors for advice. If the person counseling does not dispense godly wisdom, then the counselee is no better off and may turn to alcohol, drugs, relationships, worldly religion, etc. in order to heal their sorrow. As Dr. Baxter has pointed out here concerning these sorrows "...nothing in this world can heal" them.

Jesus said that we, especially His followers, will have sorrows in this world, but that we should have joy, because HE has overcome the world. So remember, the next time the world inflicts its sorrows upon us, we can go to One who is greater and receive His counsel, His balm, His comfort, His healing, and His joy.

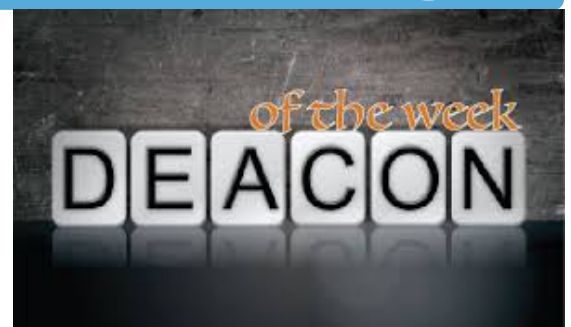
