Think on These Things

"Many people see God as a parent that we outgrow. Once we're mature and once we have overcome certain obstacles in life, we can shake off God just the same as we shook off the authority of our parents. In this pattern, some of us treat God the same way we treat our parents. We give Him a measure of respect, we give Him His due — but we no longer feel we really have to obey Him any more. In our hearts, we have moved out of the house. We think we can make our own rules in life as long as we have supper at God's house once a week and give Him a little recognition."

When Ashley sent me this, I knew that I needed to share it, because it so sums up the pervasive attitude found among so many today. Many people, professing to be Christians, are guilty of this attitude and sadly, their actions prove it.

I rarely go on facebook, but I happened to see something that I shared on my page: "Church folks and God's folks are not the same thing. Church folks go to church. God's folks are the church." Friends, God's folks are those who haven't "outgrown" Him, who have not shaken off His authority the way we may have shaken off our parents' authority, who have not "moved out of the house", and who are not satisfied having "supper at His house once a week."

God's folks recognize that when we are weak and heavy-laden, we can come to Jesus and He will give us rest (Mt 11:28); that "the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men" (I Cor 1:25), and that we need the fellowship, love, encouragement, and "feeding" from God's people and His word on a regular basis (Heb 10:24-25; Eph 5:19). God's folks recognize that God always keeps His word (Mt 24:35; Titus 1:2); that every word of the Bible is inspired by Him (2 Tim 3:16); and that Jesus Christ is the only way by which a person can enter into a relationship with God (Jn 14:6). God's folks further know that while this earth is only temporary and that we should make our time here count (Ps 90:10, 12), that He also promises that whoever fully trusts in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior will have life forevermore (Jn 3:16). 
