Think on These Things

Today is Mother's Day here in the United States. Mother's Day is celebrated in over 50 nations around the world, with some celebrating it on the 2nd Sunday of May (as we, Australia, Finland, Italy, Turkey and a few others do); some on May 10th (as in Mexico and many other Latin American countries); and one (Thailand) even celebrating this day on August 12th, which is the birthday of their current queen. Mother's Day, according to the National Restaurant Association, is now the most popular day to dine out in a restaurant in the United States. An estimated 21.2 billion dollars is expected to be spent this Mother's Day, up 5% from last year, according to a survey by the National Retail Federation. And the Greeting Card Association estimates that more than 150 million cards are exchanged in the

US every year, making it the 3rd largest card-sending holiday after Christmas and Valentine's Day. Needless to say, this holiday honoring mothers is also a very profitable one for retailers, restaurants, florists, and card makers. Today, however, I would like to direct you to a story of a mother who was only concerned about the welfare of her child and was willing to risk whatever necessary to see her child made whole.

Matthew 15:21-28 tells the story of a Gentile mother who approached Jesus on behalf of her demon-possessed daughter. She pleaded with Jesus to deliver her daughter and did not stop until He granted her plea and healed her daughter. A few things to bear in mind when reading this account: she had her race (Gentile), sex (female), the disciples (see verse 23), and seemingly even Jesus Himself (v23a,24,26) against her. Yet, she persisted

in her plea and grew in her faith in the face of these obstacles (v22,25,27) and was ultimately rewarded (v28). The point is this: she persevered in the face of the difficulties for the sake of her daughter. She epitomized the care and compassion and determination that a loving mother should possess.

This Mother's Day, I hope (if your Mother is still on this earth) that you will give your Mom a call, a hug, a card, some flowers or something from the heart to let her know that you love and appreciate her. I look forward to the day when I can see mine again and tell her: "I love you, Mom." In the meantime, I thank God for giving me such a loving mother who lived out her faith in front of her family and who did not care what others thought about her simple trust in Jesus Christ. I owe her more than I can ever repay. Thanks Mom.
