

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Think on These Things

"People are not looking for a friendly church. People are looking for a friend."

I heard this statement at a pastors meeting that I recently attended and it has been rolling around in my brain (probably a lot of empty space there) since then. One thing that I have had numerous guests say to me about their experience at FRBC is that "the people sure were friendly toward me"; "they made me feel welcome". Any pastor wants to hear these things from guests as it sure beats hearing, "Nobody spoke to me" or "People didn't seem to care if I was there or not." Being known as a "friendly church" is certainly better than being known as an unfriendly, cold, or clique-ish one. But when I heard that people aren't looking for a friendly church as much as they are looking for a friend, this brought me up short. I now must ask myself, "Am I a friend or just friendly?"

Proverbs 17:17 says that "A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity." David Jeremiah states: "Relationships built on love and fidelity are a rare treasure. True friends are faithful in times of adversity as well as prosperity." (Proverbs 18:24): "A man who has friends must himself be friendly (can also translate "may come to ruin"), but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother." "Having one true friend is much better than having many apparent friends." David Jeremiah (I could say a few things about social media here, but I'll refrain).

So, why is it so hard to make true friends? I think that being a genuine friend to someone takes time, effort, and a selflessness that few people are willing to commit. Being a true friend can often become "messy", because life often becomes messy. People are so busy nowadays that true friendship is often never attempted, let alone achieved. I know that we are all very busy, but are we too busy to seek to be a friend to someone who needs a friend? If we are too busy, then I hope that we will stop and take a long look at the sacrifice the Man who wants to be our best Friend made for us. I hope that we will take a look at His life and see that He always took time for people, even when it wasn't convenient. I hope that we will confess and repent of our selfishness and realize that He is our Example and that we are not greater (nor busier) than He. I hope and pray that He will help me to no longer be satisfied with merely being friendly, but that He will help me to be a true friend to someone who needs a true friend-just like He is to me. What about you? Are you willing?
