

### Think on These Things

Paul, in **1 Timothy 2:1-4**, encourages young Timothy (and all believers) with these words: "Therefore I exhort (encourage) first of all that supplications (petitions; specific requests), prayers, intercessions (prayers for others), and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all

men to be saved and to come to the *knowledge of the truth.*" (**NKJV**) When Paul wrote these words, the cruel Roman emperor Nero was in power. Nero was a merciless persecutor of Christians and an evil man with no regard for human life (except his own). Why in the world would Paul encourage believers to pray for this man? Because it would honor God as the Giver of all authority and so that His children could live lives of peace with their focus on Him; so that they would not constantly be looking over their shoulders, wondering if they would be arrested and persecuted for their faith in Jesus Christ. Even though Nero never ceased persecuting them, they largely remained faithful to God, trusting that He would see them through and reward them for their faith and trust in Him.

Throughout the history of Christianity, there have been rulers who hated and persecuted Christians, while at other times there have been rulers who have left Christians alone. There have even been some rulers throughout history who have professed faith in Jesus Christ (Emperor Constantine comes to mind). In any case, Christians were (and are) subject to those who are in authority. By praying for those in authority, we show our trust in God and our faith that no one is beyond His redemption. God saves all those who truly repent and trust Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. This includes people from all walks of life, even kings.

As we enter these next four years (if Jesus should tarry His return) under a newly elected President and administration, I pray that we will be in prayer for him and for all of our elected and appointed leaders. I pray that we

would ask God to give them wisdom and discernment to make decisions that would first and foremost honor Him. I pray that we would pray for the salvation of any who are lost. Finally, I pray that rather than complain about the things these leaders do or don't do, we would intercede for them and thank God that no matter who is in office, He is always on the throne.
